There was plenty going on to keep us busy in 2021, but we did not slow down our efforts to break down barriers and improve our food system. Thanks to your tremendous support, we purchased Stonefield Farm in Acton, MA, which has allowed us to expand our operations and get more food to where it is needed most.



4.5 million lbs distributed: **3.4 million lbs** distributed for hunger reilef

At our new home, we are better positioned to serve the regional food system by supporting farmers, meeting the immediate needs of people who lack access to affordable, healthy food while addressing the systemic causes of food insecurity.



Gleaning and Hunger Relief



Our volunteers contributed thousands of hours in the field and on the pack line to ensure surplus farm produce made it onto the plates of people in our community.

Boston Food Hub



Since its inception in 2021, Boston Food Hub has been successfully connecting local farmers in need of markets with buyers that value local food and nutrition. Partnerships have grown to include food banks, wholesalers, food access organizations, processors, institutions, farms, and local businesses.

By meeting the resource and capacity needs of local farmers, from sales and marketing to storage and distribution, we are increasing local growing opportunities and make farming more viable in Massachusetts.

1.6 million pounds of fresh produce sourced from **27** local farms reaching **40** unique customers

\$391,000 in revenue to our farm partners




